The Environmental Impact Statement must address the impacts of all proposed alternatives of the Comprehensive Plan, Zoning and other affiliated land use regulations **through the lens of climate change**. - Ground and Surface water quality and quantity
- Critical areas – as defined by state law, using the most up-to-date designations and maps
- Agriculture and small farms
- Forest resources
- Air Quality, including smoke and light pollution
