While I strongly believe the entire methow watershed should have the same restrictions , these should not in any way be weakened from the historic methow review district conditions.

Transportation systems must be defined to protect historic public access to public land.

Fire escape routes must be defined in the wild land urban development scenarios.

Farm land should be designated on all existing farm tax rated parcels and not on public land.

I agree with the Methow valley citizen council concerns but would note that the entire county would benefit in increased property values if more restricted planning and zoning was implemented in all the watersheds of okanogan county. Setbacks and stream buffers should protect the economic survival of listed salmon species and reduce impacts of stock grazing on water quality, noxious weeds and wildlife habitat.
